CODE OF CONDUCT / GUIDELINES

FOR CAMPERS AND COUNSELORS

The purpose of this camp is to honor and glorify Jesus Christ. During the week both camper and counselor will participate in worship, teaching, preaching and activities that will encourage spiritual growth in a Bible-centered environment. It is expected that those who choose to attend should participate by having a behavior which reflects this purpose.

1. This is a Christian camp; therefore Christian conduct, speech, dress and attitudes are expected.
2. Each camper is required to participate in all spiritual, educational, and recreational events and follow the daily schedule.
3. All dorm rooms must be empty during recreation time, unless permission is given by a camp counselor.
4. All campers will assist with the cleanup of all buildings and grounds during the week and before leaving to return home.
5. No one is allowed outside of their dorm rooms past lights out without a counselor.
6. Males are not allowed in the female rooms and females are not allowed in the male rooms at any time.
7. No camper should leave the camp area unless approved by a counselor. This includes any area of the camp that is not cleared.
8. Alcoholic beverages, tobacco, marijuana, vaping, weapons, and gambling devices are prohibited on the camp grounds.
9. No electronic equipment should be brought to camp unless it is for express use in the camp program. Questionable items may be confiscated for safekeeping and returned at the end of camp.
10. Cellphones may be used ONLY under direct supervision of a counselor. Absolutely no cellphones are allowed in the restrooms.

11. Camp Dress Code: dress modestly, according to the standards of Christ and not popular culture:
 - any clothing or jewelry with symbols or sayings should be clean and not offensive.
 - everyone must be fully dressed when traveling to and from the pool area to swim.
 - sleeveless shirts should be at least three fingers in width across the shoulder; hems of arm is extended; skirt and dress hems should be no higher than the knee
 - undergarments should never be visible; no holes on upper thighs of pants, no bare midriff, no cut out waists, no backless garments, etc.
 - athletic wear or swim trunks should not be worn during evening worship time.
 - tennis shoes are required during recreational time; shoes must always be worn outside the dorm rooms.

12. Each camper should eat the meals offered and drink lots of water for their well-being.

13. Each camper should eat the meals offered and drink plenty of water.

VIOLATIONS OF THESE GUIDELINES MAY RESULT IN THE FOLLOWING DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS:

- 1- A friendly, verbal warning
2. Restriction or revocation of privilege.
3. Dismissal from camp. Camp fee will not be refunded.

* Serious violations of camp policy or any criminal behavior will result in immediate dismissal.

LANDMARK MISSIONARY BAPTIST ENCAMPMENT GUIDELINES FOR CHURCHES SENDING KIDS TO CAMP

1. Each church must designate at least one male counselor for every 8 male campers, and one female counselor for every 8 female campers (as assigned at birth). If you plan to make arrangements with another church to meet this need, this must be done prior to the beginning of camp.
2. Counselors must be at least 18 years of age. Campers must be at least eight years old to attend camp without a parent or legal guardian. Campers attending Teen Camp must be at least 13 years of age or going into the seventh grade.
3. Each attending church must have at least one adult representative present at the counselor meeting at the beginning of camp. This person shall serve as the head counselor for their church. The head counselor will be responsible for registration and communications between the camp director and their church. Payment is expected to be given to the registrar by the end of the first day of camp.
4. Each church must review all camp rules and codes of conduct (especially concerning dress code and cell phone usage) with their campers prior to packing for camp.
5. Each church is responsible for their attendee's behavior, actions, and enforcement of camp rules at all times.
6. Each church is responsible for supervision of their campers at all times.
7. Each attending church is expected to participate in their share of camp duties, such as serving meals and general cleanup. The camp should be left better than it was found. Items left behind will be discarded.
8. Head counselors are to assign a person or persons to lead devotion in their dorm each night, prior to lights out.
9. Head counselors are to assign a person or persons to monitor medication distribution to their campers.
10. Counselors are to monitor the usage of cell phones as appropriate for calling home and organized program needs.
11. Part time campers/counselors are subject to all rules and associated fees with their stay, as determined by the registrar.
