As Catholics we are expected to attend Mass every Sunday.

Religious Education classes do not take the place of the Sunday obligation.

The classroom experience is enhanced when children attend Mass with their family and the Mass experience is enhanced by the classroom teaching.

NEW in 2019-2020 Family Faith Formation

This program is offered for families with children in public schools, but is also open to families with children in Catholic schools. Families with children in fourth grade or younger (2019-2020 school year) are encouraged to enroll. At least one parent/adult attends with the children but the entire family is invited and welcome. Age appropriate catechetical session will be offered for children ages 3, 4 & 5, as well as grades 1 - 4. All younger children are encouraged to come and stay with their family. Each program includes grade level classes, a presentation for adults, Mass, and a family learning activity.

Using our WeShare online payment program, you can make a one-time payment or pay in intervals. Creating a WeShare account is optional, but recommended.

PARENT PARTICIPATION

Because our Catholic faith is begun and nurtured at home and then is supplemented in a more formal way with Religious Education classes, it is important for parents and volunteers to support and encourage faith formation outside of the classroom setting. Some important ways to do this are:

- Attend Mass with your child(ren) on Sundays and Holy Days and receive the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation (Confession) frequently. Your example speaks volumes.
- Because we are called to be Christ's hands, feet, and voice for one another, encourage your child/ren to
 participate in the service opportunities offered in the parish and through our Middle School Youth
 Group. Many can be done as a family—again, your example speaks volumes!
- Show an interest each week in the activities happening in your child's class. Invest a few minutes each
 week to review the material your child covered while in class and to check for homework assignments
 that need to be completed and turned in on time.
- Make an effort to introduce yourself to your child's catechist and stay in contact throughout the school
 year.
- Support our parish family with your prayers, the gift of your time, and financial contributions.

SPECIAL NEEDS

We welcome all of our young people and try our best to accommodate children with special needs. We have a special needs assistant to help the Coordinator and our Volunteers. We ask that parents share any insights about their own child/ren that might be helpful for us to offer the best possible experience for all our young people. Communication is vital to our being able to tailor our program to a child's particular circumstances.

MEDICATIONS

We cannot store or dispense medications to any child.

CHRISTIAN SERVICE

Much more than just accumulating service hours, we strive to nurture an attitude of service as one of the cornerstones of living a Catholic Christian life. We understand that Jesus cares much more about our attitude and willingness to serve than simply how many hours we serve because we feel obligated. Paul writes in his letter to the Philippians: "Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus." One very good way to test our hearts for true love of God is to observe our attitude and willingness to serve others on a regular basis. Students are asked to give of their time, talent, and energy throughout the year as a way to nurture a life-long commitment to serving. While many of the service efforts can be individual projects many find ways to serve as a group. We will offer family service project days in January and March. Please check your calendar for these opportunities to serve.

STUDENT GUIDELINES

We strive to instill strong moral values and high standards of excellence in our students. We address these values and standards in a number of ways. We also strive to keep all students as safe as possible while attending classes or other events. To help with this we ask all our students to adhere to the following guidelines:

- Once parents drop off students, they should go directly into the building. Students should never leave the property until they are picked up again after dismissal.
- If no Catechist is in the classroom, please wait <u>quietly</u> in the hallway outside that assigned classroom until an adult arrives.
- Anyone needing to use the bathroom or get a drink of water should do so only before class begins,
 while changing classes, or at the end of the evening after dismissal. Only if it is an emergency, should
 you ask to be excused to use the bathroom during class time.



ABSENCES

We ask that you <u>call the Religious Education Office to report an absence (630-682-3650) before class begins</u>. If no one is in the office when you call, please leave your name, your child's name, grade and catechist's name. (We appreciate it if you would speak clearly and <u>spell</u> your last name.) If no call is received for a student who is absent, our Attendance Volunteers will call home for our middle school age students. It is the responsibility of the student to find out what was missed during an absence and to make arrangements to make up the work whenever possible.

TARDINESS / EARLY DISMISSAL

Classes begin promptly at their listed time. Students are expected to be on time. If a student arrives late for class they should first sign in with the Attendance Volunteers otherwise parents may receive a phone call reporting the student absent. A student can only be dismissed early if he or she has a written notice from a parent or guardian. The notice should be shown to the Middle School Coordinator before leaving the building. Students should sign out at the Attendance desk before leaving early.

TRAFFIC SAFETY GUIDELINES

The safety of our children is an important concern for all who participate in the Religious Education Program at St. Michael. For the convenience of families, SUNDAY CLASSES are scheduled so families can go to Mass before or after class. Since parking is limited and traffic from the church is heavy, we recommend leaving enough time, so you can park and walk your children to class, or drop your older child off a little bit away from the Willow St /Wheaton Avenue intersection. PLEASE DO NOT stop anywhere on Willow Ave and leave your car unattended to drop off a child. Wheaton Police unfortunately will ticket. Pick up for MONDAY CLASSES will be after dark most of the RE year. With all the traffic from the downtown area and the St. Michael community, walking anywhere but on the sidewalk can be risky as it can be very difficult for drivers to see pedestrians. Crossing between the School and Faith Center in the middle of the street is dangerous. Please cross only at the corner of Wheaton and Willow Avenues. Drivers should use extreme caution when in the vicinity of our buildings especially before and after class and follow the flow of traffic.


- Students whose class meets in the Faith Center (generally the 4th-8th graders) should be dropped off / picked up along Willow Avenue with cars approaching the Faith Center from the east. Students should exit / enter the vehicle only on the sidewalk side and not into the street. Vehicles may NOT make a left turn into the school parking lot.
- Students whose class meets in the School should be dropped off / picked up in the school parking lot. Vehicles should approach the lot from the west, make a right hand turn into the parking lot and drive around to the front door of the school where the student must only exit /enter from the sidewalk. Drivers then exit the parking lot making a right turn only onto Willow Avenue going east.

PARKING

Please be aware there is no parking at West Suburban Bank AT ANY TIME. (Parking in that lot may result in you being towed.)

WHAT TO EXPECT ON MONDAY CLASS NIGHT

• COME FOR SOM (SUPPORT QUR MISSION): This is offered 1/2 hour before 6 p.m. class begins. Students are invited to come to the Faith Center 2nd floor for dinner or what we call, Come for SOM, to meet with friends or just "hang out." This time is optional and students are free to arrive any time in the half hour before classes begin. We sell pizza, snacks, desserts, and drinks until 10 minutes before class begins for a nominal fee. The profits are used to fund scholarships for our week-long summer mission trip with Catholic Heart Workcamp. (All 7th and 8th graders are invited and encouraged to experience Catholic Heart Workcamp!)

PARENTS, PLEASE OFFER YOUR SUPPORT IN PRAYER AND AS A VOLUNTEER.

A generous tuition credit for Catechists, Catechist Aides and Attendance desk volunteers is offered for parents who have children enrolled in these classes.

Ongoing training and support are offered throughout the year.

FIRE ALARM / SEVERE WEATHER WARNINGS

- Everyone must exit the building when the fire alarm sounds. Students should stay together with their class. If a student is not with your class when the alarm sounds, they should exit immediately and go to the school parking lot to find their class.
- In case of a severe weather alarm, when instructed, everyone should go into the hallways outside your classroom and be seated along the walls. Remain there until instructed otherwise.

COMMUNICATION

- E-mail is the main way we communicate with parents and families throughout the year.
- Facebook St. Michael Religious Education has a page on Facebook. "Like" this page by searching for "St. Michael Wheaton Religious Education". This page is meant for informational purposes, which we will use for emergency closings, meeting reminders, etc.

Emergency Closings - In case of an emergency including hazardous winter road conditions, extreme cold, or tornados, Religious Education classes may be canceled. We use Flocknotes to email, text and/or call to notify families if a closing occurs. It is imperative that we have a correct email and phone number on file for your family.

SECURITY ISSUES

- All Volunteers will be given a name badge to wear at all times while in the building for security and safety reasons. All classroom visitors must report to the office prior to any class visitation. All students should carry the folder given to them at the beginning of the school year to each class. The label on the outside cover of the folder serves as their Religious Education ID. If you lose your name badge or folder, we ask that you request a new one from the Religious Education Office.
- Access to St. Michael School In order to continue to provide a secure environment for the students, all doors will be locked at all times and will be accessible only through Door 1 by a keypad code given to students at the first class. The code is only good during RE class times.
- Access to the Faith Center The front door and doors leading to each floor of the building will be locked at all times and accessible by a keypad code given to the students at the first class. The code is only good on during RE class times.
- Two attendance volunteers are stationed in the school building and two in the Faith Center during
 every class. They are responsible for picking up and recording the attendance at the beginning of the
 each class and monitor access to the classrooms during class time.
- Please respect all personal items, projects, books, posters, etc. and any other equipment or supplies that are either on display or left in the classrooms or in the hallways. They may be viewed, but not touched or disturbed. Students should sit only in the classroom chairs. Sitting on top of the desks, on tables, or on the arms of furniture may cause them to break.
- Please *walk* in the hallways and throughout the buildings. Quiet, "inside" voices are to be used.
- The elevators are to be used <u>only by students in wheelchairs or with an injury that requires a cast or crutches.</u>

DISIPLINE ISSUES

Our catechists, and aides are volunteers. While most are not professionally trained teachers, they deserve our utmost respect and courtesy. Students likewise deserve to be treated with respect and courtesy. Coming to class is a privilege. Behavior, representing the Christian ideals of our parish, is expected at all times. Problems in the classroom will first be handled by the Catechist or aide. If the behavior problem persists, the Coordinator, parents and child (when appropriate) will be asked to become involved in correcting the situation.

VISITORS

Visitors are always welcome, but for the safety of all, we ask that you contact the Coordinator <u>prior</u> to your visit. This applies to both a visiting student or adult.
