Expedition Guide Responsibilities

Classroom Coordinators for Expedition E are responsible for the following:

Outpost Setup

Location

Ideally your class should be located in a room that is not a thoroughfare, has adequate space, easy access to a safe outdoor play area, and a bathroom nearby.

Decorations

Transform your classroom into the Backpackers' "Outpost"; consult your VBS Decorations Coordinator for ideas. Display visual aids at child level so they may be easily seen and touched when appropriate. Items not to be touched by the children should be hung from the ceiling or placed higher on walls.

Furniture

Tables and chairs should be child-sized, with plenty of room to walk around them. Have a higher table or shelf to keep materials easily accessible to Guides.

Campfire Circle (circle time area)

Set up a pretend campfire (sidebar) and spread out mats so the Backpackers can sit "around the campfire" for group activities.

Safety

Safety check your Outpost and remove all untouchables. Make sure all electrical outlets are covered and window cords out of reach.

Cleanup

Have a pail and sponge and/or disinfectant wipes, a broom and dust pan and/or vacuum, and garbage cans readily at hand for easy cleanup.

Easy "Campfire"

- Fire Pit: Use a low galvanized tub.
- Flames: Tape large red, orange, and yellow paper triangles on inside rim of the tub.
- Logs: Place paper towel tubes in bottom of tub.



TIPS FOR THE TRAIL

Outpost Rules

Clearly explain your rules concerning the use of toys and materials, snack time, obedience, and getting along with the other children. Gently but firmly discipline when necessary, according to your church's policy.

Down-to-Earth Expectations

Keep your expectations realistic for your Backpackers. The week will be long for these little ones and the goal is for both them and their teachers to enjoy their Upward Bound experience.

Outpost Supplies

- Device to play music
- pillows, mats, sleeping bags, or blankets for rest time
- Learning Site materials
- tissues, paper towels, cleanup and diaper changing supplies

Hands-On Activities

The daily schedule allows for two periods which provide hands-on learning experiences.

Arrival Time Activities

These may be repeated each day or rotated for variety (see list on pages 8-9)

Learning Sites

Learning Sites are specifically designed to follow each Bible lesson presentation to reinforce the day's Biblical truths. Detailed instructions begin on page 12.

Unless your Director has already appointed a Learning Site Coordinator, delegate responsibility to one or more Guides/Assistant Guides for planning, setup, supervision, and takedown of daily activities. Note that *it is not necessary to use every lesson-specific Site each day*; select those you believe will be most effective and manageable in your particular situation.

Summit Celebration (closing program)

Ask your Director if your Expedition will sing a song and/or recite your memory verse in the final closing program for family and friends; if so, plan to practice on Days 4 and/or 5.

Backup Ideas

Have music, relevant picture books, a list of stand-up exercises and other backup activity ideas on hand to use if the need arises.

Clock Patrol

Keep your Expedition on schedule!



Developmental Realities for 2's & 3's

General

The first reality to consider for these little ones is the significant developmental span between the "just two's" and the "almost four's." Be sure to learn the age of each child and *adjust your expectations accordingly*; otherwise you may make the mistake of underestimating the petite child and expecting too much of the faster-growing child.

Physically

These children are very active and need lots of space in which to move around. Be flexible about their sitting down for the Bible story; some will need to get up and touch the visual aids. Many of them will have only beginning coloring skills.

Emotionally

2's & 3's need lots of approval, some individual attention, and full acceptance of the unique person God has created each one of them to be. Allow each child to be special! Try not to hurry them, and watch for indications of frustration *before* behavior problems arise. If a child is having a difficult time, provide an alternate activity. Pressuring a resistant child usually leads to tears, class disruption, and the need to take Mom or Dad away from her or his VBS assignment.

Spiritually

Coming from the homes of your VBS staff, most of the children receive their primary Christian teaching from their parents and Sunday School. Your teaching should be seen as an adjunct to their Christian education. Reinforce basic Gospel truths and reduce lesson material to an extremely simple narrative form. Encourage the children to pray. Their prayers may sound like mumbling to you, but their heavenly Father hears them very clearly!

Cognitively

Children of two or three learn with simple rote—repeat, repeat, repeat! And because they learn with their whole bodies, do as much with drama, hand motions, sounds, and other sensory activities as possible! (Don't ask them to learn just by sitting and listening to accommodate an adult teaching style of "teaching by talking.") Appeal to the children's curiosity. Remember that the attention span is very short at this age, so alternate busy and quiet activities. Make learning fun and leave the children with wonderful memories of Upward Bound!

On the Trail Leading Your Backpackers Through Upward Bound

About the Schedule

The schedule that follows breaks the day into short segments. It is wise to move young children on to the next activity before they become bored and find their own "creative" alternatives! At each transition make short, clear statements to direct your Backpackers. For example, rather than asking, "Would you like to sit down and listen to a story?" say,

> "It's time to pick up the blocks. I see Sam putting his blocks away... Let's sit on our mats. I like the way Sarah is sitting on her mat.... Now we're ready to sing some songs!"

Keep the same schedule each day to give the children a growing sense of security as the week progresses and they become familiar with the daily routine.

Arrival Time Activities

- Expect staff children to arrive early because of their parents' roles.
- Prior to the children's arrival, set up several activities from the list below with enough space to comfortably accomodate four to five Backpackers supervised by a Guide/Assistant Guide. These activities should be brought out only for arrival playtime.
 - brown play-clay (recipe on page 16), rollers, rocks, small twigs, plastic forest animals, insects, snakes, birds
 - nativity play sets, picture books, toys, puzzles related to the day's lesson where possible
 - picture books and puppets related to the outdoor theme
 - music of both upbeat and quiet music (e.g., Upward Bound

Music, Wee Sing Bible Songs[®], etc.)

- building blocks with animals and/or lesson-related items and pictures (print lesson pictures on cardstock and attach to blocks)
- portable plastic slide, climber, ride-on toys, large balls
- bean bags or soft foam balls for tossing into small coolers
- activities listed in sidebar, page 8

Campfire Circle

- Lampfire Circle (whole-group circle time) sets the tone for the entire day, focusing the children's attention on the day's biblical truths.
- Lincourage every Backpacker to participate in this group activity.
- Assign Guides/Assistant Guides to help specific children and model enthusiastic participation.
- The same Guide should lead Campfire Circle time every day so the children become accustomed to listening to this one teacher.

"Hello, Hiker" Greeting Game

Begin Campfire Circle with the name game described in the sidebar, or a similar activity.

Lesson Teasers and Climbing Cheers

- ♣ Use the **Lesson Teasers** and props (pages 11–12) to prepare the Backpackers for the Bible lesson presentation.
- Introduce the **Climbing Cheer** (chart below)—a short phrase summarizing each day's lesson truth.
- Practice the Climbing Cheer during your Lesson Teaser time.
- Lonclude Campfire Circle by saying the cheer together.



"Hello, Hiker" **Greeting Game**

(sung to the tune of "Skip to My Lou")

- Backpackers hold hands and form circle around Guide.
- As they sing the first line, Backpackers "hike" around Guide who looks through binoculars to choose a child.

TIPS FOR THE TRALL

Save Your Props

Save props from each day's Lesson Teaser and Bible lesson presentation for the following days' reviews.

Songs and Finger Plays

Simple songs and finger plays are great transitional cues for this age group. Use songs to introduce listening times, snack, cleanup, and rest times.

Lesson Teasers

(to prepare the children for the Bible lesson)

Lesson 1: The Surprising Journey — Born in the Likeness of Men

- Show a Bible and an envelope and talk about how the Bible is God's letter to us. Emphasize that everything in the Bible is true and the stories in the Bible that we will hear at Upward Bound really happened.
- Show children a glass of clean water, to represent that God made Adam and Eve perfect.
- Show children a glass of dirty water, which represents sin and our need for redemption.
- Explain that today they will learn how Jesus—God Himself came into our world as a baby to be our Savior, to take away our sin and make us clean.
- Climbing Cheer: *"Jesus came down!"*

Lesson 2: The Humbling Journey — The Form of a Servant

- Review yesterday's lesson. Show a Bible again to emphasize that our lessons are from God's Word.
- Play a game of Simon Says.
- Talk about obedience in their daily lives as 2 & 3 year olds.
- Explain that today they will learn that when Jesus was a little boy He always obeyed His earthly parents and God, His Father in Heaven.
- Climbing Cheer: "We must obey God!"

Lesson 3: The Obedient Journey — Humbled Himself by Being Obedient

- Review previous lessons. Show a Bible again to emphasize that our lessons are from God's Word.
- Set out cookies on a plate but explain that we can't eat them yet.
- Talk about the difficulty of resisting the temptation to eat the cookies.
- Explain that today they will learn that Jesus was tempted but never sinned, that He always did what the Bible says to do, and we need to as well.
- Give permission to eat the cookies! (Make sure to do this before it becomes a stumbling block.)
- Climbing Cheer: "Follow God's Word!"

Lesson 4: The Painful Journey — Obedient to Death on a Cross

- Review previous lessons. Show a Bible again to emphasize that our lessons are from God's Word.
- Ask children if they have ever had a time out, hit someone,



grabbed a toy that someone else has, disobeyed, etc.

- Discuss our sin nature and need for salvation.
- Explain that today they will learn that Jesus suffered and died to forgive our sins.
- Climbing Cheer: "Jesus saves sinners!"

Lesson 5: The Joy of the Journey — God Has Highly Exalted Him

Materials: Bible, padlock with key, 2 or 3 non-corresponding keys, tray

- Review previous lessons with saved props. Show a Bible again to emphasize that our lessons are from God's Word.
- Put lock and a few non-corresponding keys on tray.
- Help children take turns trying to open lock with various keys.
- Bring out the matching key and open lock.
- Discuss that only God's way will "unlock" the door to Heaven.
- Explain that today they will learn that believing in Jesus is the only way to Heaven.
- Climbing Cheer: "Jesus is alive!"

Lesson-Specific Learning Sites

While your Backpackers are still seated in Campfire Circle, briefly explain each of the day's Learning Sites, showing the craft sample and the completed activity pages. Guides and Assistant Guides then rotate groups through the Sites.

Day 1 "Jesus Christ Came Down From Heaven" Action Song (to the tune of London Bridge)	 Instructions: Play this modified version of London Bridge. Explain that the Backpackers are going for a special hike in a pretend forest. One or more pairs of Guides are "trees," their "branches" extended and touching to form an arch under which the Backpackers "hike" single file as they sing the verse(s) below to the tune of London Bridge. During the final phrase, the Guides' "boughs break" and their lowered arms catch several Backpackers. Have the "captured" children say their Climbing Cheer, "Jesus came down!", before releasing them. Repeat with new children using additional verses if desired. For variety have the children hop, clap, skip, etc., as they hike. 			
	 Lyrics: Jesus Christ came down from Heaven, down from heaven, down from Heaven. Jesus Christ came down from Heaven to save sinners! Day 2 "Searching Jerusalem" Hide and Seek	 Materials: 6 large boxes of varying size Scroll In Advance: Create the city of Jerusalem with crawl-through and open-the-flap cardboard box "buildings." Have 1 especially tall (or otherwise designated) box be the Temple at the course's end. Place scroll in Temple. 			
	 Instructions: Line children up single file, explaining they are going to search the city of Jerusalem looking for Jesus, just like Jesus' worried mommy and daddy did. After walking around, crawling through, and peeking in flap doors of each "building," wind up at the Temple. Direct childrens' focus to the scroll, explaining that Jesus was talking about God's Word with the Temple teachers. Ask, "What did Jesus say when His mommy and daddy found Him?" Help them answer, "Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?" 			
Day 3 "Jesus in the Desert" Obstacle Course	 Materials: Sizeable stones (or brown paper bags crump branches, dried brush, and rubber snakes, Loaf of bread, box of "jewels," Temple box fi 	izards, scorpions, stuffed lions, etc.		



Day 3 (continued)	 In Advance: Set up a simple desert life obstacle course with materials listed above. Along the way place loaf of bread alongside Bible, box of "jewels" and Bible, and the Temple box (from yesterday's Trail Break) and Bible to represent each temptation. Instructions: As the children navigate the course, remind them of the hardships and possible dangers ("scary things like desert snakes!") Jesus endured, trusting in His Father's care. At each temptation have each child point to the Bible and say, "Follow God's Word!"
Day 4 "Run to the Cross" Rock Relay	 Materials: 1 "rock" per child (see Obstacle Course, Day 3, above) Large cardboard or wooden cross Instructions: Organize a simple relay as follows: Have the children form several lines and distribute rock to each child. On the other side of the play area have a Guide hold up the cross. Explain to the children that their rocks represent our sins which we can take to Jesus in prayer for forgiveness. Have them run to the cross, place (not throw!) their rock/sin at the cross' foot, shout "Jesus forgives sinners!" and run back again.
Day 5 "Upward Bound to Heaven!" Rope Run	 Materials: 1 or more 10–20 foot lengths of rope, clothesline, or strong twine Sturdy cardboard tube (inner tubes from plastic wrap are best), one per rope length (Optional) Posterboard picture representing Heaven Instructions: Slip rope through cardboard tube. Have Guide at each rope end, one crouched down at "earth," the other standing, creating an incline "to Heaven" (adjust to within children's reach). (Optional) Have standing Guide hold "Heaven" picture. (see 2's & 3's Memory Book, page 3) Have the children line up, then run "Upward Bound to Heaven!" sliding the tube the length of the rope. At "Heaven" have each child shout "Jesus is alive!"
