Memory Verse:
Isaiah 7:14
Therefore the Lord

you a sign. Behold,
the virgin shall
conceive and bear
a son, and shall call
his name
Immanuel.

Questions to ask:

- o Why does Pharaoh want to kill all the baby boys?
- o Who takes care of the baby Moses in the end?
- o Why is *Immanuel* a good name for Jesus?

Kids, ask your parents if they can tell you about a time when they had an opportunity to talk to someone about Jesus.

God Calls Moses

Memory Verse:

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel .

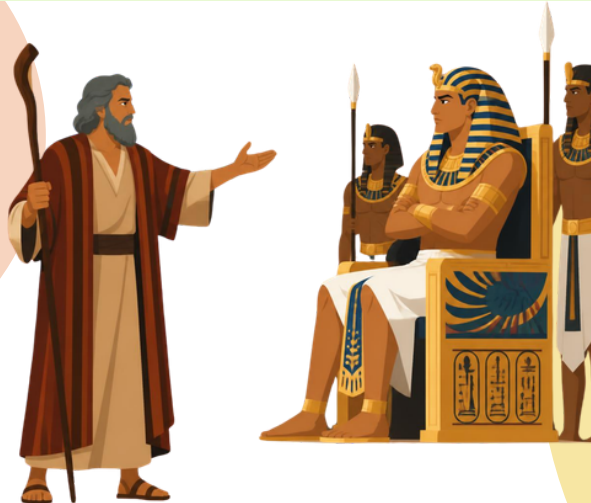
Questions to ask:

- o Why did Moses run away from Egypt?
- o God told Moses that his name was “I AM WHO I AM.” What kind of name is that?
- o Why doesn't God destroy Moses when he sins?

Kids, ask your parents if they can remember a time when you argued with them because you didn't want to do what they were asking you to do.

Moses Confronts Pharaoh

Memory Verse:
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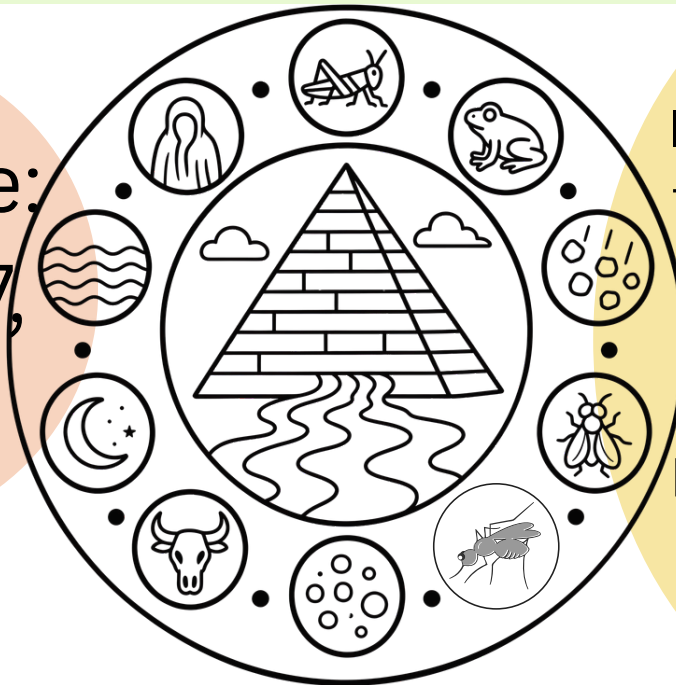
Questions to ask:

- o Can you remember a time when something you were trying to do did not go well?
- o What does God teach us as he helps us get through difficult times?
- o What does it mean to have a hardened heart? (A hard heart is one that doesn't want to let God's Word in.)

Kids, ask your parents if they remember reading or hearing about this story when they were little.

God Sends Plagues against Egypt

Questions to ask:

- o Which of the plagues was the most terrible? Why?
- o What happened to God's people during the plagues?
- o Who hardened Paharoah's heart?

Kids, ask your parents to tell you what they would do if someone tried to keep you and not let you go.

Questions to ask:

- o What did God say would happen after the last plague?
- o Where does the name “Passover” come from? Why did God tell the Israelites to celebrate it every year?
- o Did the Israelites leave Egypt the way God planned?

Kids, ask your parents what it felt like when they were finally free from a large debt or bank loan, and how getting out of debt is a little bit like Israel getting out of slavery.

God Parts the Red Sea

Memory Verse: Isaiah 9:6-7

Questions to ask:

- o How does the last plague and the Passover point forward to Jesus?
- o Pharaoh thought he was in control, but who was really in control of everything?
- o Can you think of an area of your life where you could use God's help to get you through?

Kids, ask your parents if they can remember a time when God provided a way through a difficult time for them.

God Provides Food and Water for Israel

Memory Verse: Isaiah 9:6-7

Questions to ask:

- o Why did Israel complain?
- o What could they have done instead of complaining?
- o How was God merciful to Israel?

Kids, ask your parents if they were ever in a situation where they complained because they didn't get what they wanted.

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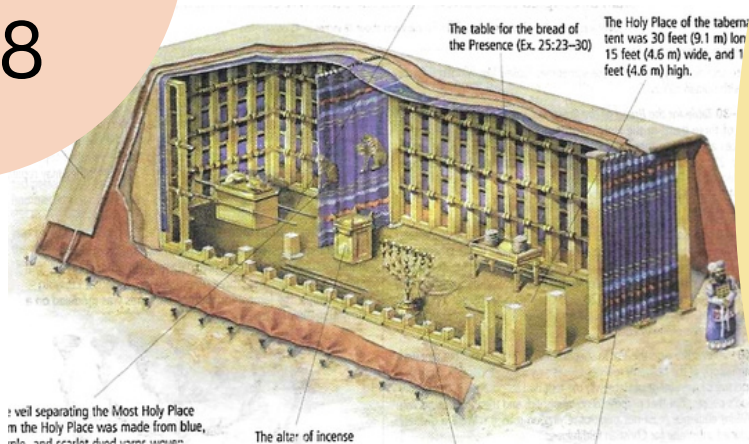
Questions to ask:

Kids, ask your parents what kind of things you have to hear more than once to make sure you do them.

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Counselor, Mighty God,
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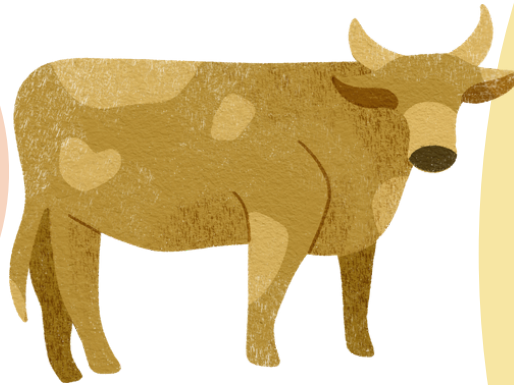
Questions to ask:

- o Why did God build an altar for Israel? Why don't we need an altar today?

Kids, ask your parents if they have a story of a time when they forgot someone's name.

Kids, ask your parents if they ever heard about something they were later shocked to see for themselves.

Questions to ask:

- o How did the people know that Moses was meeting with God?
- o How does God live among us today?
- o Why couldn't Moses see the face of God?
- o How did killing a lamb in place of the firstborn son point forward to Jesus?

Kids, ask your parents if they can remember a time when someone gave them a second chance.

The People of Israel Complain

Questions to ask:

- o Can you think of something you complain about?
- o When Israel complained, whom were they sinning against? Whom are we sinning against when we complain?
- o Is there anything that you enjoy that you are tempted to want and love more than God?

Kids, ask your parents if they ever greedily took more of something than they needed.

Miriam

Questions to ask:

- o What does “envy” mean? Have you felt envious of your brother, sister, or friend?
- o Even when parents are not around to catch you in your sin, who is always watching?
- o What can we learn from Miriam and Aaron’s lives?

Kids, ask your parents if they can remember a time when God humbled them for their pride.

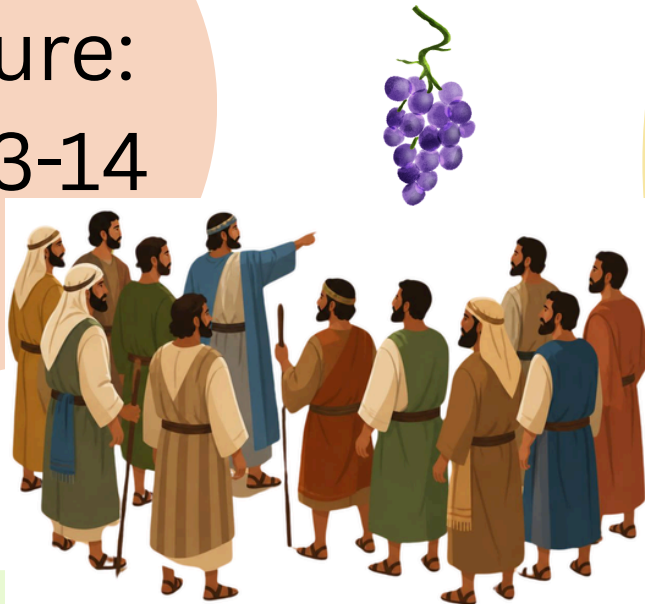
Israel Spies Out the Land

Questions to ask:

- o What did most of the spies do wrong?
- o How did the spies' bad report affect the people? How was Caleb's report different from the others?
- o Ask your parents what you can do about your repeated sins? (Trust Jesus to take your sins away.)
- o How did God keep his promise to Abraham in this story?

Kids, ask your parents if there is an area in your life where you disobey again and again.

Questions to ask:

- o How are we like Israel? What can we learn from Israel's mistakes?
- o How does God show mercy instead of judgment?
- o Why didn't Moses obey God? How can we fall into the same pattern of sin in our lives?

Kids, ask your parents to tell you about a time when they got angry because things didn't go the way they wanted.

God Heals Israel with a Bronze Snake

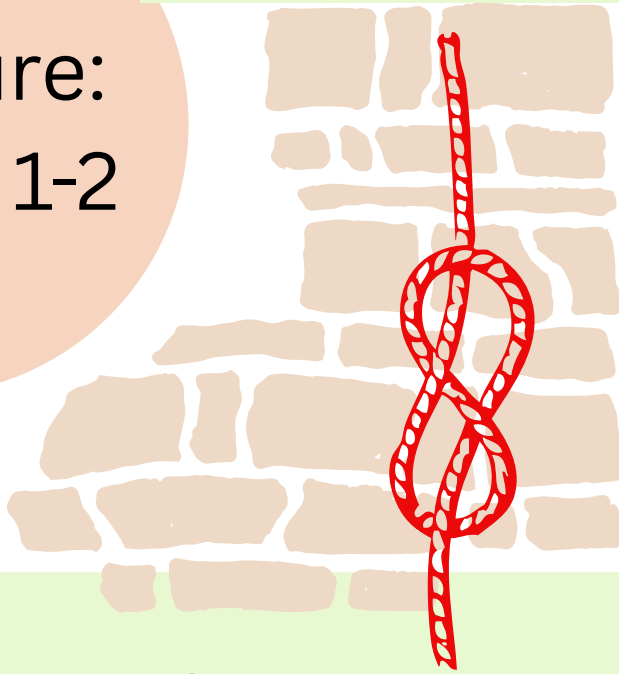
Questions to ask:

- o How are we weak like Israel?
- o Is there a sin that you repeat over and over again?
- o Who does the bronze snake on a pole point forward to? What happens when we look to Jesus who was lifted up on the cross and died for us?

Kids, as a family try to think of at least one thing you need God's help with, then pray and ask God for help.

Rahab's Help

Questions to ask:

- o What was the command that the Lord repeated to Joshua?
- o Why can trusting in God give us courage?
- o What in our story tells us that Rehab was trusting in God?

Kids, ask your parents what their favorite part of this story is.

Questions to ask:

- o How can miracles God did for Israel help make our faith strong?
- o Why did God have the 12 tribes of Israel set up a pile of stones where they crossed the river?
- o How are we like Rahab?

Kids, ask your parents to tell you about a time when God provided something for them in a way that they knew it was by God's grace, not their own effort.

Israel and Ai

Memory Verse:

Questions to ask:

- o Why did Israel lose the battle with Ai?
- o How did God know someone had stolen some of the devoted things?
- o What is different about the second attack on Ai from the first one that failed?

Kids, ask your parents to explain what an ambush is.

God Calls Gideon

Questions to ask:

- o How did God use the trouble and suffering caused by the Midianites to help Israel?
- o Why was Gideon hiding in the winepress?
- o How did the Spirit of God help Gideon when he was afraid?

Kids, ask your parents to tell you about a trial God brought to your family to help you call out to God for help.

Gideon's Victory

Memory Verse:

Questions to ask:

- o Why did God send most of the Gideon's men home?
- o Gideon was distracted from serving God with gold and many wives. What kind of things could distract you from following God?
- o Even though Gideon's men fought the battle, who helped Israel win?

Kids, ask your parents if they can think of a time when they became afraid late at night.

God Gives Samson Strength Memory Verse:

Judges 13-14



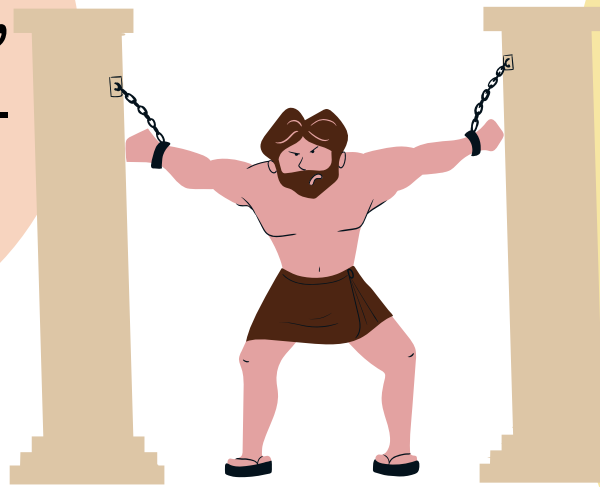
Questions to ask:

- o Can you think of a reason why God wanted to save Israel even though they were disobeying him?
- o Can you think of some of the names God is called?
- o Did Samson honor the Lord for helping him kill the lion? Why did God bless Samson anyway?

Kids, ask your parents if they remember a person whom God blessed with wonderful abilities but who became proud.

- o Ruth learned about the true God from Naomi and her husband. Who are you learning about God from?
- o Who is our Redeemer?

Kids, ask your parents if your mom was surprised when your dad asked her to marry him.
