GETTING STARTED

Small Group time is meant to be with a group of similar-age peers that gather with a consistent leader throughout the week. The activities are designed to review each day's Bible story, help kids apply each day's Bottom Line, introduce and review the Memory Verse, and include a time of prayer. Small Group time is an important VBS rotation as it helps kids interact and talk about what they've been learning about each day. We like to say the Bible story isn't over until the kids know what to do with it. Small Group is meant to move kids to action. You can think of it as an opportunity for discipleship for your VBS week.

NOTE: Things like Bible Navigation and Salvation Conversations are written into the Small Group plans. See the Special Needs adaptations for any groups that include children with disabilities.

1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Party Guests" Activity Page, large gift bag filled with streamers, balloons, noise makers, and party hats

WHAT YOU DO:

- Ask kids to sit in a circle.
- · Set out the gift bag with party decorations in the middle.
- Figure out who has the closest birthday, and explain that they will be your first "guest" to the party.
- Hand your guest a card from the "Party Guests" Activity Page, and explain that
 they will be learning about some other people who are invited to this party.
 Ask them to read it out loud.
- After reading it, direct the first "guest" to stand up and choose a decoration from the gift bag. They should remain standing while holding their decoration as the rest of the scenario cards are read.
 - If they choose a balloon, they can inflate it, knot it, and hold it.
 - If they choose a party hat, they can put it on their head.
 - If they choose streamers, they can rip a section off and place the rest of the roll back in the bag.
 - If they choose a noise maker, let them blow into it once or twice before just holding it.
- Continue until everyone in the group has had a chance to read a card and hold a decoration, or until there are no more cards left.
- Let your group know they did an outstanding job preparing for a party! Have them place the decorations back in the bag, and then invite them to sit down again.
- Ask the following questions for discussion:
 - What did you find in common about all the guests at our party?
 - Have you ever been to a party where not everything is perfect?
 - Have you ever had a time where someone you invited caused problems at a party?
- Remind kids that no one is perfect. Sometimes things go wrong. Sometimes we
 make mistakes, or we receive things we don't deserve. No matter what, Jesus
 is a good reason to have a party. Jesus would love each of these people we
 read about, and He loves each of us, too! We can always celebrate the love
 He has for us.

^{*}Please note that Matthew and Levi are the same person. He is sometimes referred to as Levi in scripture and sometimes called Matthew. Either name that is being used is referring to the tax collector that Jesus called to be one of his disciples.

2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW] WHAT YOU NEED: "Dinner Party Checklist" Activity Page, "Dinner Party Leader Guide" Activity Page, 11x17 paper, markers

WHAT YOU DO:

Divide your group into two teams.

GROUPS

- Instruct each team to form a line on one end of your group space. At the opposite end of your group space, place an 11x17 piece of paper and a marker for each team.
- · Give the first kid in each line a "Dinner Party Checklist" Activity Page.
- Explain that some people plan fancy dinner parties using a guideline for a formal place setting.
- Tell kids that they will be working together with their team to create their own formal place setting. Using the checklist, they will take turns drawing the items on their team's paper, making their best guess for where each item belongs.
- When you say, "Go," the first kid in line for each team will:
 - Run to their team's paper and use the marker to draw the first item on the checklist as if the paper is a place setting at a table.
 - Label the item after drawing it.
 - Check off the first item on the checklist.
 - Run back to their team, hand the checklist to the second kid in line, and then join the back of their team's line.
- The next person in line will then run to the paper, do the same for the second item on the checklist, and so on.
- Teams will continue until they have drawn every item on their list.
- Once both teams are finished, look at each of their drawings and compare it to the answer key from the "Dinner Party Leader Guide" Activity Page.
- The team to get the most items placed correctly is the winning team. If both teams got the same number of items correct, the team that finished first is the winning team. (More than likely, kids will get many of these items placed incorrectly, as they have probably never experienced a formal dinner party.)
- Tell kids that even when cake forks and water glasses are put in the wrong places, the dinner party still goes on!
- · Ask kids how they think Matthew may have felt while getting ready for the party he invited Jesus to.
- Explain that Matthew also wasn't getting things right, yet Jesus still chose to hang out with him, because He loves him! For Matthew, that was reason enough to celebrate!

4. VERSES TO TAKE WITH YOU

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]
WHAT YOU NEED: "Verse Banner" Activity Page, string, confetti, bins, Bibles

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide your group into two teams. Tell each team to huddle up on one end of your group space.
- Give each team a Bible and a piece of string.
- Lead each team to look up Acts 2:28 using the Bible Navigation tips below, and read it together as a team.

Finding verses with Preteens: Our verse is from Acts. Ask kids to tell you whether that's in the Old Testament or the New Testament. (New) Direct kids toward the back of the Bible—about a third of the way through the New Testament. When they find Acts, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Tell them to find chapter 2. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Tell them to them find verse 28 in chapter 2.

- On the opposite end of your group space, place the two prepared bins of confetti and "Verse Banner" Activity Page pieces.
- Explain that when you say, "PARTY TIME," one kid from each team will run to their team's bin. They will need to search through the confetti to find the first words of Acts 2:28. They should use their Bible to help them figure out what words they are looking for. Once they find it, they will run back to their group and thread the pennant onto their piece of string.
- Then another person from their team will run to the bin to retrieve the second set of words.
- Continue playing until every part of Acts 2:28 has been strung on the banner.
 Have kids from each team work together to hold up the string to their banners
 to display their verse. Verses must be complete and displayed in the correct
 order.
- The first team to have their verse strung correctly is the winning team!
- Give each team a chance to read the verse together for the whole group.

5. MAKE IT PERSONAL WITH PRAYER

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Start the Party Prayer Time Keychains" (main piece and Start the Party add-on); Optional: "Start the Party Preteen" Activity Page

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each of the kids the main part of the "Start the Party Prayer Time Keychains" along with today's Start the Party add-on. (If you're not purchasing the keychains, you can simply use the "Start the Party Preteen" Activity Page as described.)
- Explain to kids that praying is simply having a conversation with God. We can talk to God any time we want. We don't have to use special words. We don't have to wait until certain times of the day. We can tell God anything any time! God cares about what's going on in our lives.
- Assure kids that none of us are perfect when it comes to prayer. It's easy to forget to pray or to sometimes not even know what to talk to God about.
- · Tell kids that each day, they are going to get a symbol as a reminder of something they can talk to God about. Whenever they see the symbol, it can be an encouragement that God is with them and listening to what they have to say.
- Explain that this first symbol will be a reminder that Jesus is a good reason to have a party. When they see it, they can pray as a way to say thank you for God's love. And they can ask God to fill them with joy as a result of that love.
- Say a prayer for your group.

NOTE: Place each kid's keychain and Activity Page in a sandwich bag. Write their name on the bag with a permanent marker. Collect each bag and set aside for the next day.

1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Party Invitation" Activity Page, pens or pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite kids to sit together in your group space.
- · Ask the following question. Be sure to facilitate a group discussion where kids respect each other and take turns talking.
 - Who are some people who may not feel invited to the party?
- You may need to help initiate this discussion. Guide them to consider people they know who are often left out-not necessarily from a "party" but from various things in life. Help them to think about those who may not have access to certain opportunities or peers at school who seem to remain on the outside of things.
- After discussing, hand each kid a copy of the "Party Invitation" Activity Page and a pen or pencil.
- Explain that they should take time to think of a specific person in their life who they could invite to church, start a friendship with, or talk to about Jesus and His love for them. Give them a few minutes of quiet time to work on their invitations.
- Explain what they are supposed to write on the indicated lines:
 - Who: The person's name
 - What: What they plan to invite them to: a certain event? a friendship?
 - When: Specific opportunities where they can reach out to this person
 - How: Will they sit with them on the bus? Will they send a text? Etc.
- Encourage kids to take these invitations home as a reminder to make an effort with the person they wrote about on their invitation. It could be a reminder for them to pray and ask God to help them be inviting.

2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]
WHAT YOU NEED: "Cake Wars" Activity Page, gift boxes in different sizes

WHAT YOU DO:

• Divide the group into two teams, and have each team huddle up together. Give each team a set of assorted boxes.

- Explain that they're going to play a game to review the Bible story while
 pretending the gift boxes are layers of a wedding cake, since there was a
 wedding in the story.
- Explain the game directions:
 - Teams will take turns answering a review question from the story.
 - If correct, they will get to add more layers to their "cake." Cake layers should be stacked from largest to smallest.
 - The first team to get all their layers stacked wins!
- Ask kids if anyone has ever been part of a wedding (flower girl, ring bearer, etc). Choose someone who has been in a wedding, and let that team go first.
- Ask the first question from the "Cake Wars" Activity Page. Give the team an opportunity to discuss and then share their answer.
 - If correct, they can find the largest sized gift box and start their wedding cake. The other team takes their turn next.
 - If incorrect, the question goes to the other team.
 - If the other team answers the question correctly, they get to place a cake layer, and then take another turn.
 - If they answer the question incorrectly, they don't get to place a cake layer, but they still get to take another turn.
- Continue taking turns asking questions until one team has completely stacked all their cake layers. That team wins!
- [Make It Personal] Once the game is over, share with the group about a time when you were invited to something where you didn't feel like you belonged. Explain how it made you feel to be included.

4. VERSES TO TAKE WITH YOU

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Balloon Verses" Activity Page, prepared balloons, Bibles, pens or pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide your group into two teams.
- Each team should assign the following roles to three people on their team:
 - Balloon Blower
 - Scripture Finder
 - Answer Writer
- · Tell each team to line up with the Balloon Blower at one end of the line and the Scripture Finder on the other. The Answer Writer can be anywhere in line.
- Hand each team's Balloon Blower their set of five balloons.
- Hand each team's Scripture Finder a Bible.
- Hand each team's Answer Writer a copy of the "Balloon Verses" Activity Page and a pen or pencil.
- When you say "Go," the Balloon Blower on each team will choose a balloon to blow up, tie, and hand to the next kid in line.
- Kids continue passing the balloon until it reaches the Scripture Finder on the
- The Scripture Finder will then look at the Bible reference written on the balloon and use the Bible to find that verse. They will read the verse out loud so the entire team can hear it.
- Then the Answer Writer will read the question on the "Balloon Verses" Activity Page that is associated with the verse that was read out loud. The team can work together to answer the question, and the Answer Writer will write it down on the activity page.
- Teams will continue this process until each balloon has been inflated and passed, all verses have been read, and all answers have been written.
- The first team to complete this is the winning team.

1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Cone-shaped party hats, plastic shower cap, shaving cream, pom-poms, paper towels

WHAT YOU DO:

- Ask for a volunteer who isn't opposed to getting a little messy, and invite them to stand with you in front of the group.
- Carefully secure the plastic shower cap over their head (including hair), and strap the party hat over the shower cap on top of their head.
- Rub shaving cream on the outside of the party hat, covering as much of it as possible. Use paper towels to clean up.
- Ask the rest of the kids to think of examples of good news they've celebrated in their own lives or in the lives of others.
 - For example: winning a softball tournament, finally getting their first cell phone, a family member finding out they are cancer free, etc.
- Each time a kid shares an example, give them a pom-pom to toss at the party hat so it sticks to the shaving cream.
- Continue taking turns to give everyone plenty of opportunities to share, as time allows.
- When finished, remove the party hat and shower cap from the volunteer's head, and invite them to sit down with the rest of the group. Provide paper towels to clean up, if needed.
- Ask the following questions, and allow time for discussion:
 - What's the best news you've ever heard?
 - Have you ever felt like the younger son who was forgiven?
 - Have you ever felt like the older son who didn't think his brother deserved a celebration?
- Remind kids that in the parable Jesus told, the son who was welcomed home was able to celebrate the good news of unconditional love and forgiveness. The older son felt jealous because he hadn't done anything wrong, and yet the party was for his brother, who messed up. But the father was celebrating the good news of having both of his sons being home. We should remember that no matter what, we can always join the party and celebrate the good news of what Jesus did for all of us!
- Be open to any kids in your group that may have questions about what Jesus did on the cross and what it means to have a relationship with Him. Follow your church's protocol as it pertains to facilitating conversations with kids about faith and salvation.
- Option: For a less messy version of this game, omit the shaving cream and shower cap. Instead, you can have the volunteer hold the party hat upside down on top of their head, and kids can toss the pom-pom balls into the hat.

WHAT YOU DO:

- · Invite the kids in your group to spread out and sit down.
- Hand each kid a piece of paper and a pen or pencil. If you choose to use markers, let kids share markers.
- Ask kids to share examples of reasons to throw a "Welcome Home" party.
 - For example: military deployment, buying a new house, coming home from the hospital after having a baby, kid coming home from college, etc.
- Ask kids to think of what they would want their "Welcome Home" party to look like if they ever had one, and tell them to draw a picture of it on their papers.
 - They may want to draw things like their favorite foods, guests they would invite, games they would want to play, etc. Encourage them to be creative and come up with their own, unique ideas.
- When everyone has finished their drawings, give each kid in the group a chance to share what they drew and explain their perfect "Welcome Home" party.
- After everyone has had a turn to share, ask the following questions:
 - Who does the father symbolize in the Parable of the Lost Son? (God)
 - What was the most important gift the father gave the son? (forgiveness)
 - In the story, forgiveness led to a "Welcome Home" party for the son. What
 does forgiveness lead to for us? (a relationship with God that will last forever)
 - Have you ever experienced God's forgiveness?
- [Make It Personal] Share how you have experienced God's forgiveness in your own life. If you feel comfortable, explain how Jesus' sacrifice on the cross has changed your life forever.
- Give each kid a "Response Card" Activity Page.
 - Talk about how God loves us and gave Jesus for us. Talk about how Jesus lived a perfect life and died so we could have a relationship with God that lasts forever.
 - Give each kid a card from the "Preteen Response Card" Activity Page.
 - Give kids time to read through each statement on the card.
 - Set out the highlighters.
 - As you read through each statement again, invite kids to highlight the statement if it matches how they feel. Don't pressure kids to highlight any statement. They can also simply highlight some of the artwork on the card.
 - When done, ask kids to flip their cards over to write their names on the back and to write down any questions they have about following Jesus.

NOTE: For kids who have questions or seem ready to take a step of faith, follow your church's plan and policy about introducing kids to salvation. If you know a kid's parents are believers and would want to be part of the moment when their child takes a step of faith, be sure to follow up with that family and give them the chance to have this conversation themselves.







1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Balloon, light bulb; Optional: cardboard box, piece of wool

WHAT YOU DO:

- Choose a volunteer who can blow up a balloon.
- Hand them the balloon. Ask them to blow it up and tie it before returning it to you.
- Choose another volunteer who doesn't mind getting their hair messed up.
 - Ask for permission to rub the balloon on their hair, and then do it long enough to build up some static electricity.
 - Optional: Rubbing the balloon on clothing or a piece of wool will also generate static electricity, if preferred.
- NOTE: The rest of the activity will work best with dim lighting.
 - If you are in a place where you can turn off the lights, switch them off or
 - If you are not in a place where the lights can be turned off, set out a large cardboard box.
- Choose another volunteer to hold the light bulb.
- Wave the balloon back and forth directly over the light bulb in a quick motion.
 - The static electricity that the balloon is carrying should cause the light bulb to flicker on as you wave it.
 - If you are not in a place where the lights can be turned off, let kids take turns looking inside the cardboard box as you wave the balloon over the lightbulb the volunteer is holding inside the box.
- Repeat the experiment, if time allows, for other kids to try it.
- Explain that if we are going to be the light of the world, as Jesus asked of us, it requires action on our part. We cannot expect to shine Jesus' light and share His love with others if we aren't willing to be party starters!
- Ask: What can you do to "shine your light"?

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW] WHAT YOU NEED: "Glow Party Game" Activity Page, cones or two-liter bottles, glow necklaces

WHAT YOU DO:

· Divide the group into two teams and direct each team to form a line on one side of your group space.

- Arrange the prepared cones or bottles on the other end of your group space.
 - Line the cones or bottles up in number order, single file, across from each team so that the "3" is furthest away from the kids and the "1" is closest, forming two identical lines of cones or bottles across from both teams.
- Hand the first kid in each line a glow necklace.

GROUPS

- Explain they will toss the glow necklace and try to make it land around one of the cones or bottles.
 - If they don't make it onto a cone or bottle, or if they make it onto the opposite team's cone or bottle, they will go to the end of the line.
 - If the necklace lands on a cone, you will ask them a question from the "Glow Party Game" Activity Page that coincides with the number on the cone. (Explain that the number indicates the level of difficulty for their question.)
- · If they get the answer right, their team gets the number of points according to that cone.
- If they get the answer wrong, their team get no points, and the question can be used again for another turn.
- Continue playing in this way until all questions have been asked. Whichever team has the most points at the end is the winner!
- Invite kids to sit down. Ask the following questions:
 - What does it actually mean to start the party?
 - Who in your life can you start the party with?
 - How can you start the party with people who you don't know or who may be different than you? (ie: a new kid at school or someone who needs to feel included)
- Hand each kid two glow necklaces. Explain that they can keep one for themselves. But they can use the other to give to a friend when they invite them to do something. Challenge your group to think about this as they go through the rest of their summer. Remind them how important it is to love ALL people, and one way we can do that is to invite people into our world who aren't typically included.

- Invite kids to say the secret message together: BE A PARTY STARTER!
- Ask this question:
 - What does it take to start the party?
- Encourage kids to remember that the Bible can help guide us throughout the rest of our lives. God's Word is here for us to have all the time. It can encourage us and point us in the right direction.

5. MAKE IT PERSONAL WITH PRAYER

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY] WHAT YOU NEED: "Start the Party Prayer Time Keychains" (main piece and disco ball add-on); Optional: "Disco Ball Preteen" Activity Page

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid their sandwich bag from the previous day containing their "Start the Party Prayer Time Keychains." Give each kid today's disco ball add-on. (If you're not purchasing the keychains, use the "Disco Ball Preteen" Activity Page in the same way.)
- Remind kids what you discussed previously about prayer.
 - Praying is having a conversation with God any time we want. We don't have to use special words. We don't have to wait until certain times of the day. We can tell God anything any time! God cares about what's going on in our lives.
- Explain that today's symbol can be a reminder that [Bottom Line] you can be a party starter. When they see it, they can ask God to help them shine their light to people around them! Just like a disco ball reflects light all around a room, they can reflect the light of Jesus wherever they are.
- Ask: How can YOU start the party?
- Say a prayer for your group, making sure to pray for each individual kid. Ask God to use them to start the party after VBS is over.

NOTE: Return each kid's keychain and Activity Page to the sandwich bag with their name on it (or create one for those who recently joined the group.) Collect each bag and set aside for them to take home later.


